



Disaster Relief Program Affected Counties

On March 23, 2018, the Board of Directors of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Indianapolis approved the activation of the Disaster Relief Program (“DRP”) with an allocation of up to \$250,000 to aid homeowners affected by the significant flooding within the FHLBank Indianapolis district. Eligible homeowners may request up to \$10,000 in DRP grant funds to make qualified repairs to their primary residence.

To qualify for DRP funds, a homeowner must reside within one of the following 35 counties in Indiana or 20 counties and 2 cities in Michigan with a declared disaster/emergency status.

Indiana has currently issued disaster/emergency declarations for 35 counties:

Benton, Carroll, Clark, Crawford, Dearborn, Elkhart, Floyd, Fulton, Gibson, Harrison, Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Lake, LaPorte, Marshall, Newton, Noble, Ohio, Perry, Porter, Posey, Pulaski, Spencer, St. Joseph, Starke, Switzerland, Vanderburgh, Vermillion, Wabash, Warren, Warrick and White.

Michigan has currently issued disaster/emergency declarations for 20 counties and 2 cities:

Allegan, Arenac, Barry, Berrien, Cass, Clare, Eaton, Gogebic, Houghton, Ingham, Ionia, Kalamazoo, Kent, Mecosta, Menominee, Newaygo, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Ottawa and St. Joseph counties, as well as the cities of Grand Rapids and Lansing.
