

ARTIST BIOS AND FEATURED WORKS

Donald Calloway — Detroit

Painter and sculptural artist **Donald Calloway has** been essential in the Detroit arts community for nearly 30 years. Calloway recognized his passion for the arts at the tender age of three and has been solely dedicated to his artistic endeavors since. He honed the technical aspects of the arts at the Center for Creative Studies, then continued his practice at the Greektown Lofts, where his studio has famously remained. Calloway's meticulous constructions, intentional brush strokes, and bold use of colors has resulted in a signature style that is known and beloved throughout the city and beyond.

Winner of the Plowshares Theatre Company Sankofa Arts Award, Calloway's work has been featured in numerous solo and group exhibitions with such organizations as the Detroit Institute of Arts, Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History, Arts Extended Gallery, Delta Sigma Theta, Liberal Arts Gallery, and National Conference of Artists Gallery.

Jonathan Kimble — Detroit

In his words: "I was raised on Detroit's east side, and witnessing the reestablishment of the city's culture moved me to embrace my style of layering and reconstruction in my picture-making. I am driven by Detroit's resilience to be innovative by any means necessary, which taught me to be fearless in my use of various mediums, marks and brush strokes. The newfound hope in Detroit's urban community makes me proud that I'm joined with its fine arts community representing our love and passion. I appreciate my tutelage at Detroit's College for Creative Studies because it advanced my wealth of knowledge in the art community and sowed seeds towards my style which honors a combination of expressionism and comic book illustration. Artists I feel left the biggest impression on my work on me were, Jacob Lawrence, Bill Sienkiewicz, Cbabi Bayoc, Frank Morrison, Francis Vallejo and Gil Ashby. Those artists and influences reflect my love for abstract shape design, color, mark-making, and highly gestural drawing and painting."

Amai Kinji Rawls Jr. (aka "Brochevski") — Indianapolis

Brochevski (Amai Kinji Rawls Jr.) is an American artist who creates collages using hand-cut U.S. currency to place a monetary value on the emotional rollercoaster that is life. He only uses real and 100% authentic currency to create his artworks, adding that the authenticity further validates his subject matter and dedication to his work. The artist uses the mutilated currency to recreate scenes combining his external surroundings and introvertive imagination, telling a story where every character is played by George Washington. The surreal landscapes and vignettes featured in his work explore a wide range of emotional components in human life, while questioning society's obsession with material status and disregard for personal well-being.






Senghor Reid — Detroit

Senghor Reid explores the interactions between the human body and the environment, creating visual representations of dreams, memories and traces of human contact with nature. Reid earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor; a Masters of Teaching in Art Education from Wayne State University in Detroit; and he and attended the internationally recognized Marathon Program at the New York Studio School of Drawing, Painting and Sculpture in New York.

He is currently an artist-in-residence at the Cranbrook Schools in Bloomfield Hills, Mich., and is a National Board Certified Visual Arts Educator. He has received many awards, including the Kresge Foundation's Kresge Arts in Detroit Visual Artist Fellowship prize and the prestigious Governor's Award for Emerging Artist (Michigan). Reid's work has been exhibited in the U.S. and abroad in galleries and museums, including the Museum of Contemporary Art – Detroit in Michigan; Kentler International Drawing Space in New York; St. Catharine Museum in Canada; and the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture in New York. His work is in private, public and corporate art collections.

While Nicolena Stubbs obtained a degree in journalism, she supported herself working as a professional print, runway model and spokesperson. She also created a hand-crafted jewelry line at age 18. Her hobbies include writing, poetry and sketching, so art has always been part of her DNA. After obtaining her degree, she discovered that career path did not suit her. She continued traveling and performing what she calls "living art" as a model. In 2020, she began painting prolifically and showed her work publicly for the first time in 2021 in a solo art show. Since then, her work has been shown in several collaborative shows throughout Michigan. In 2022, she was asked to be resident artist for Keller Williams City offices in Detroit, where she uses this shared space as a gallery/showroom, hosting and curating shows and art events designed to highlight other Michigan artists and local non-profit organizations.






Salma Taman — Indianapolis





Shirley Woodson — Detroit

Shirley Woodson is an American visual artist, educator, mentor and art collector who is most known for her spectacular figurative paintings depicting African American history. Her career work spans 60 years and counting can be found in the collections of the Detroit Institute of Arts; the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History; and the Studio Museum in Harlem, among other institutions. Woodson was named the 2021 Kresge Eminent Artist. The Detroit Institute of Arts exhibited 11 of her pieces in "Shirley Woodson: Shield of the Nile" Dec. 18, 2021 through June 12, 2022. Woodson debuted her work in a show of Michigan artists at the Detroit Institute of Arts in 1960, the same year she started teaching in the Detroit Public Schools. She has participated exhibitions at institutions including the Academy of Arts and Letters in New York; the Oakland Museum in California; and other venues as far away as Dakar, Senegal, and Lagos, Nigeria, as well as

Born in 1936 in Pulaski, Tenn., Woodson has lived in Detroit since she was three months old, when her parents moved their family of four. In seventh grade, she was selected to participate in a weekly special arts training at the Detroit Institute of Arts, where she would go on to take classes each Saturday through high school. "It was sort of my most favorite place to be. Whenever I left home, I wanted to go to the museum," Woodson recalls in the 2021 Kresge Foundation Eminent Artist monograph.

She earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Wayne State University in 1958 and her Master of Arts from Wayne State in 1966. Between earning her B.F.A. and M.A., Woodson did graduate work at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago (1960) and pursued independent study in Rome, Paris and Stockholm (1962).
